Dwight L. "Jack" Moody passed away on Monday, October 27, 2008. Jack was born in Pueblo, Colorado June 23, 1927. He joined the Marines in May of 1945, and served his Country for 4 years, until May of 1949. He joined the Austin Police Department March 17, 1951 and retired as a Senior Sergeant in September of 1981 after 30 years of service. He had a love of golf most of his life, and also spent thousands of hours playing solitaire, while going through many, many decks of cards. Jack was also a ferocious reader of paperback books, The National Geographic, and his beloved World War II books. And, he never missed a day of working the crossword puzzle with a pen, not a pencil! But, even with all of those interests, he loved his dogs the most. Dude, a Basset Hound, and Honey, a Corgi, enjoyed sharing his breakfast every morning, and sleeping with him at night. Jack was predeceased by his parents, C.W. and Bessie Moody.
